### Application Procedure:

Students will submit a preliminary application for graduate admissions to the university at the Undergraduate Student Visitation Program

### Eligibility:

Students should have an interest in attending graduate school in a program offered at Howard University or the University of Texas at El Paso and in pursuing a Ph.D. degree in a science, technology, engineering, or mathematics discipline.

### Criteria:

Students should

- have a 3.0 or higher cumulative GPA
- be in their final year of undergraduate or master's study
- be a United States citizen or permanent resident
- have a major or minor in a science, technology, engineering, or mathematics field

The **Alliances for Graduate Education and the Professoriate** (AGEP) program seeks to increase significantly the number of Black (African-American), Hispanic and American Indian/Alaskan Native (Native American) students receiving doctoral degrees in all disciplines funded by the National Science Foundation (NSF).

The goal of the University of Texas at El Paso's (UTEP) **AGEP Undergraduate Visitation Program** is to provide undergraduate students with firsthand experience and exposure to graduate education and to recruit students from the science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) disciplines.

### THREE DAY CONFERENCE

The PhD Programs offered at The University of Texas at El Paso and the benefits of being a part of the AGEP program will be highlighted in a 3 Day Conference\* aimed at Undergraduates and Master's students who are interested in pursuing a doctoral degree in the Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics Disciplines.

During the program, students will

- attend graduate workshop
- visit laboratories and research centers
- meet with graduate faculty and students

\*Hotel accommodations, meals, and the cost of round trip transportation will be provided for all participants of the three day conference.

### HUTEP

Howard University's five-year-old Alliance for Graduate Education and the Professoriate (AGEP) program, originally funded in 1998, and the University of Texas-El Paso (UTEP) have joined to form a unique partnership to increase underrepresented minority student doctoral enrollment, graduation, and preparation of students for faculty careers in the science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) disciplines.
